1.Saras Baug (24 Km, 1Hr.)

The Sarasbaug temple houses the idol of Shree Siddhivinayak (God who makes wishes true). A sacred ground of faith for millions of devotees in Pune and around the world, on an average the Sarasbaug temple receives ten thousand visitors a day and this figure goes upto eighty thousand devotees per day on Ganesha Chaturthi and other special occasions. Various dignitaries and luminaries throughtout India have made it a point to visit this sacred temple to seek blessings of Shri Siddivinayak.



2. Shaniwar Wada (26 Km, 15Min)

Shaniwarwada was the stately mansion originally built as the residence of the Peshwas. The foundation of the mansion was laid by Bajirao 1 in the year 1730 AD and construction was completed in 1732 AD at a cost of Rs. 16,120. Several additions were made to the palace like fortification walls with bastions, gates and court halls by his successors.



3. Lal Mahal (26.2km,02Min)

Lal Mahal is an important monument in Pune city, Lal Mahal is a red brick building situated at Pune. Shivaji spent here most of his childhood. There are statues of "Jijamata" (Shivaji's Mother) and a structure showing young Shivaji plowing with a golden plough, with mother Jijabai and Guru Dadoji Konddev looking at him. Incidents from Shivaji Maharaja's life are pictorially represented on the walls of this palace. There is also a garden dedicated to Jijamata, known as Jijamata Garden.



4. Dagdu sheth Ganapati (26.5 Km, 5min)

The Shreemant Dagdusheth Halwai Ganapati temple is one of the most popular and ancient Ganesha temples in India. It is a prominent tourist attraction in Pune and is visited by devotees all year round. The Dagdusheth Halwai temple gets its name from Shri Dagdusheth Halwai who installed it along with his wife Lakshuibai after they lost their only son to the plague epidemic.



5. Katraj Snake Park (34 Km, 45Min)

Katraj Snake Park is one of the popular conservation parks of India, situated on the Pune-Satara Highway. It is known for housing a significant population of snakes, birds, turtles, reptiles, etc. Situated at a distance of approximately 8 km from the Pune city of Maharashtra, the park was established in 1986.



6. Pu La Deshpande Garden (43Km, 45Min.)

Pu La Deshpande Park, Okayama Friendship Garden, the Japanese Garden, Sinhgad Road Gardens and parks in the city of Pune contribute a lot in enhancing the beauty of the city. Moreover these are the places that contain ample fresh air replete with oxygen which is a rarity otherwise in the city.



7.Gram Sanskruti Udyan, Pashan (17Km,35Min.)

The latest attraction to join Pune sightseeing map is Gram Sanskruti Udyan. Known as Pune's first mock village, this park is located near Someshwar Temple.
